HOMEWORK REQUESTS

If your child will be out of school for more than three days, you can request assignments by calling the Guidance Office Ext. 2488 with your child's name, dates of absences, and a medical excuse or have principal approval. There will be a 24-hour wait period to allow teachers to prepare materials. The assignments will then be available for pickup.

Scheduling for the 2018-19 School Year

Scheduling books will be distributed to all current 9th, 10th, & 11th grade students in February. It is very important for students to review the courses for prior to course selection with their counselor. If you would like to discuss your child's options, please make an appointment to meet with your child's counselor during Parent-Teacher Conferences in February 7th & 8th.

Testing in the Spring of 2018

Testing has expanded as a requirement of the Ohio Department of Education. Your child will receive a detailed schedule of their testing dates through the months of March, April, & May.

- Students who have been enrolled in high school for three years will be required to take the ٠ ACT which is paid for by the state. On March 20th, it is imperative that these students are in school on-time . There are very limited opportunities to make-up this test.
- EOC/AIR Testing: Students taking English I & II, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, U.S. Histo-۲ ry, U.S. Government and any student who has not earned 18 points or lacks a proficient score in any previously attempted test. April 9th-May 15th.
- Results from students who attempted a test in December will be received the last week of ۲ February.
