Scholarship Application Postmark Deadline: <u>April 5, 2019</u>

The William D. Squires Educational Foundation is a small private family foundation that was created in 1999 with the sole purpose of helping high school students in Ohio follow their dreams. The William D. Squires Scholarship is primarily a financial need-based scholarship. The award is \$4,000 per year and is renewable up to three additional years for a total of \$16,000! Fifteen scholarships will be awarded to the Class of 2019 and there is no fee to apply.

Who is eligible to apply for The William D. Squires Scholarship?

Applicants must meet <u>all</u> of the following requirements:

- 1. Applicants must be seniors, residing in Ohio, graduating from an Ohio high school in 2019.
- 2. Eligibility is primarily based upon financial need. The EFC on the finalized FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR) must be less than \$7,000. Finalists must have at least a \$4,000 "need" to receive this scholarship.
- 3. Applicants must already know their career goal and be highly motivated to reach their goal.
- 4. Applicants must be planning to attend an accredited 4 year post-secondary educational institution on a full-time basis by the fall of 2019. The school of choice does not need to be in Ohio but must have a program leading to a degree in the student's chosen field.
- 5. Although this is not primarily an academic based scholarship, applicants must demonstrate academic promise and good character. A minimum 3.20 cumulative GPA is required.

How to apply for The William D. Squires Scholarship

If you are eligible, that's great! We recommend you review all 8 pages before completing pages 5-8. Details are on the next page. You will need to mail the following 5 items in one large envelope by the **postmark deadline of Friday, April 5th.**

Scholarship Application Checklist: (details of each item are on page 2)

- 1. Pages 5 8 of the notarized application
- 2. Current transcript, including current class schedule & your best ACT scores
- 3. Complete copy of your finalized SAR
- 4. 2 letters of recommendation
- 5. 1 page typed essay

General application guidelines

After determining your eligibility, review the rest of this application and complete pages 5-8. Please do not type or alter the application. Black ink is preferred. Have your application notarized. Next, gather the other items on the checklist on page 1. The final request is an essay about your career goal. The detailed instructions for the items on the checklist, including the essay, can be found below. All information is held in strict confidence. You may black out social security numbers on your Student Aid Report from FAFSA.

Mail pages 5-8 of the notarized application and requested items together in one large envelope by the deadline. Due to the volume of applications, we do not accept items mailed in separate envelopes and you should not enclose any extra items that have not been requested. <u>Extras</u> such as activity lists, resumes, folders and photos will not be reviewed by Selection Committee members.

Parents and others: Please do not complete the application or essay for the student.

The application process is lengthy and the instructions are detailed in an effort to help each applicant have an equal chance at receiving one of our scholarships. We would prefer to meet every student in person. Since that is not possible, we must rely upon this two dimensional process. Please help us get to know you through your application.

Detailed instructions for the items on the scholarship application checklist

#1 <u>Pages 5-8 of the application</u> Complete each section thoroughly and have page 8 notarized. Please email the Foundation if you have specific questions.

#2 <u>Transcripts and current class schedule and ACT test scores</u> Enclose a current official copy of your high school transcript. Verify that your transcript is complete. It must include grades from at least 1 semester from your senior year and current class schedule. If your ACT scores are not on your transcript, provide a printout of ACT test scores from your best test date. If you did not take the ACT, we will accept SAT test scores.

If you have been able to take college level courses that are not on your high school transcript, please provide a transcript. If it is not yet available, enclose a class schedule for college coursework.

>>Special note: Transcripts are not uniform for all schools. There is a problem when an abbreviation on a transcript does not adequately describe a course. It is helpful if you list the abbreviation and course name when we ask you to list coursework on page 6. (sections 4 & 5)

#3 <u>SAR</u> (Student Aid Report from FAFSA) This scholarship is financial need-based. Your SAR must indicate an EFC under \$7,000. Enclose a complete copy (not just the cover sheet) of your finalized SAR which must include your responses on your FAFSA, your name and your EFC. We cannot accept an estimated EFC or a partial SAR. In case you aren't familiar with these abbreviations, we have additional information on the <u>Q & A</u> page of our website.

#4 <u>Letters of recommendation</u> Two letters of recommendation are required. Letters from anyone who knows you well, will be accepted.

Please <u>ask the author</u> of each letter to: 1) Sign and date the letter. 2) State their relationship to you in their letter. 3) Advise them not to mail them separately to the Foundation but they may enclose them in a sealed envelope.

#5 <u>Essay</u>

Essay topic: My Career Goal

Essay Format: It is important to the selection committee that you type your essay, single or double spaced. Limit it to only 1 side of 1 page in length. Include your name and your career goal at the top of the essay.

Essay Content: Keep in mind that this is not a writing contest. The Selection Committee is simply interested in learning about <u>your career goal</u>. Please elaborate and include answers to these questions.

- 1. What major, undergraduate degree and career goal have you selected?
- 2. Please elaborate about what (or who) motivated your decision and include why it will be a good fit for you.
- 3. Do you have requirements other than undergraduate coursework to reach your degree and career goal? *(for example: an internship, co-op, or graduate school)*

After You Apply

The names of our 15 lucky new scholarship recipients will be posted on our website around the end of May.

Are you an optimist? We hope so but even if you are not, we suggest you keep pages 3 - 4 of the application for reference.

Selection Process

- 1. A Screening Committee will check all applications for eligibility and completeness.
- 2. The Scholarship Selection Committee is comprised of members of the Foundation's Board of Directors plus at least 50% of the committee are individuals that are not related to The William D. Squires Educational Foundation.
- 3. The selection process is a major undertaking but very rewarding for the committee members. Each eligible application will be thoroughly reviewed. The 15 finalists and alternates will be selected on an objective and non-discriminatory basis.
- 4. This is a financial need-based scholarship. In order to receive this scholarship, each finalist must be attending a 4-year college and have a minimum financial need of \$4,000 for freshman year. Therefore, each finalist will be called and asked to forward a copy of their Financial Aid Award letter from the school they will be attending within 7 days. The award letter should state all financial aid, including private aid for freshman year.
- 5. Please note that our definition of "need" favors the student. We include loans that must be repaid and work study, along with the balance owed by the student. It is rare that students have less than a \$4,000 need and therefore, finalists are most always recipients. If a finalist has received a full scholarship, does not have a \$4,000 need, or declines the scholarship for any reason, the scholarship will be passed to an alternate.
- 6. After verifying financial need, each of the final 15 selected recipients will be notified again by phone and congratulated.
- 7. The names of our scholarship recipients will be posted on our website as soon as all 15 of the recipients have accepted the scholarship, usually by the end of May. All applicants should check our website to verify their status. Due to the volume of applicants, the remaining applicants will not be notified.

If you are a scholarship recipient: **Congratulations!**

- The scholarship award is \$4,000 per calendar year. The Foundation will send the payments in equal installments directly to your school, prior to each term. Your school will be advised that The William D. Squires Scholarship may only be used for undergraduate tuition, books, related school fees, room and board.
- 2. This scholarship may be renewed up to three additional years or if graduating early, until graduation from an undergraduate program. In order to continue receiving the scholarship award following the first year, recipients will be expected to send a transcript to the Foundation at the end of each term, earn a minimum 2.50 GPA, and complete a short questionnaire each summer.
- 3. Evidence that coursework is leading to the student's specified career goal will be required and students must remain in school full-time. The recipient's chosen school will define "full-time." Special circumstances will be considered on an individual basis.
- 4. Students choosing to graduate in less than 4 years will forfeit future scholarship payments.
- 5. In the event a scholarship recipient is unable to meet the terms of the scholarship during the 4 years, no further scholarship payments will be made.
- 6. The William D. Squires Educational Foundation reserves the right to make minor changes to this program, as it deems necessary.

<u>Scholarship application postmark deadline</u>: Friday, April 5, 2019. No exceptions. It is not necessary to spend extra money for express mail since your application will be accepted after the deadline if it is clearly postmarked by April 5^{th} .

Questions about FAFSA? We require a complete and finalized copy of your SAR from FAFSA. Your EFC must be less than \$7,000. Please see the Q & A page of our website for more information.

Notarized Affidavit: The applicant plus a parent or guardian must sign Section 9 on page 8 in the presence of a notary. (Do not sign in advance.) Yes, even if you are 18, a parent, guardian or school counselor must sign. Be sure to bring your ID. The signatures can be notarized at separate times. If you cannot find a notary, many banks offer the service. There may be a small fee.
