Love Politics? Consider attending Buckeye Boys/Girls State Summer 2019

Any Junior interested in politics & in attending Buckeye Girls State/Buckeye Boys State this summer should see their counselor for details. This is a week-long experience at an Ohio University in which students participate in a mock government experience.

College Credit Plus 2019-20

Any student interested in taking Dual Enrollment Courses through the College Credit Plus Program should take the following steps:

- " Take the March ACT (if a junior) or the April ACT (for other grades) if not previously taken.
- "Complete the Intent Form and return it to the Guidance Office.
- "Sign-up for Remind notifications—sign-up by texting @wghccp to the number 81010 or sign-up for the app by browsing rmd.at/wghccp & follow the instructions.
- "Applications for each university will be completed in February. Students will meet in small groups in the next two weeks with Mrs. Kampf-Melillo to determine their preferences.

Testing in the Spring of 2019

Testing is a requirement of the Ohio Department of Education. Your child will receive a detailed schedule of their testing dates through the months of March, April, & May.

- Students who have been enrolled in high school for three years will be required to take the ACT which is paid for by the state. On March 12, it is imperative that these students are in school on-time. There are very limited opportunities to make-up this test.
- ♦ EOC/AIR Testing: Students taking English I & II, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, U.S. History, U.S. Government and any student who has not earned 18 points or lacks a proficient score in any previously attempted test. March 25-May 8.
- Results for students who attempted a test in December will be received the last week of February.
- ♦ Students enrolled in AP courses will test May 6-15.
