- **Progressbook:** This is the live on-line gradebook and schedule. Student grades will be maintained in this software. This is the official academic grades software. Both parents and students have accounts. If you are unable to access your account—contact Lisa Duncan (Guidance Secretary)
- **Teams:** This is the software in which student courses and assignments are posted. These accounts are issued to students only.

CREDIT BREAKDOWN

Confused about your grade level on your schedule? The following credits earned determine the grade level that is assigned on your schedule and report card.

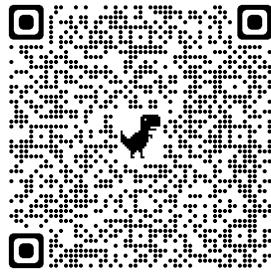
9th: 0-4.75 credits

10th: 5-10 credits

11th: 10.25-15.75 credits

12th: 16+ credits

This year every student in the Class of 2023,2024,& 2025 have a daily 30-minute Raider Day period . Three days a week students will receive an academic lesson. One day has an English lesson, one day has a Math lesson, and the third will focus on an academic check-in or a teacher request to work in greater depth with a small group of students. Two days are dedicated to Social Emotional Learning and Career/Post-Secondary Planning.



One of the targeted lessons reviewed the Graduation Seals and each student declared which seals they intended to earn by the time they graduated. HOMEWORK REQUESTS

PSAT/NMSQT Testing

- Juniors & Sophomores have the opportunity to take the PSAT on October 13 at Harding.
- Cost: \$18 Registration is in the Harding Bookroom.
- Benefits of the test are: Practice half-length version of the SAT College Entrance Exam, qualifies students for several scholarship banks including the National Merit Scholarship Program, assesses academic skills needed for college.
- *Seats are limited and given on a first come, first serve basis.*
