- November will focus on Academic Intervention/Enrichment by using both teacher produced lessons and Exact Path. Exact Path is computer software program that uses student data from MAP testing to provide a personalized learning path, which will enhance student assessment performance.
- December will focus on Career Resumes and Exploration and Social Emotional Learning Lessons focused on Gratitude and Active Listening



Class of 2024 Sophomore Updates from Ms. Mizik

- The next several 10th Grade Raider Day career lessons will help students identify their personal support networks. Who are the people they can lean on when they need help with academics, a disagreement with a friend, or just getting back on track? Students sometimes describe feeling alone, but when they start looking deeper, they realize that they actually have a group of people standing beside them.
- The Class of 2024 will also begin building their student resume in Naviance, the platform used by WGH for career and post-secondary choices. A resume will be important as they begin to apply for employment, consider National Honor Society next year, and will be crucial throughout their senior year. Starting now and adding activities as they are completed will make the process easier in the coming years.
- Sophomores have participated in over 220 individual appointments with Ms. Mizik so far this year. In many of these meetings, we discuss course selection and how those courses relate to the careers they have saved in Naviance. Other appointments address social or emotional concerns.



Class of 2025 Freshman Updates from Mr. Lowery

- 9th grades students that completed the PSAT 8/9 results will be receiving their results in December. The results of the test will link to Khan Academy that will provide them with resources and information to prepare them for the SAT in 11th Grade. Students who take the PSAT 8/9, PSAT 10, and the SAT are also given the opportunity to be included in several scholarship banks provided through Collegeboard.
- 9th grade students that are interested in participating in the various extracurricular activities can contact me to get more information or see what is offered. Some of our after school programming provides tutoring opportunities for our students.
- If your student is participating or planning to participate interscholastic athletic competition, marching band, or cheerleading instead of the ½ credit of physical education for graduation requirement, they can obtain a PE waiver form from the Guidance Office.
- As we push through the first semester, this would be a great time to do a "Semester Check-in" with your student on how their high school experience is going so far.

Class of 2023 Junior Updates from Ms. Vogler

As the mid-mark of the 2nd 9 weeks vastly approached us, Ms. Vogler has seen many of her students working on their academics, which is always a good sign. She has had many conversations with parents and listened to the concerns of her students regarding their academics. For Raider Day, students have been getting extra help from ExactPath. This will help students when they take their EOC exams, either in December or in the Spring. Once the ExactPath intervention is complete, career readiness and social-emotional lessons will continue. Ms. Vogler is working with *Big Brothers Big Sisters of Mahoning Valley's* employee, Mrs. Rebecca Robinson, to complete student interviews during the school day via video call for those students who signed up to be in the Big Brother Big Sister program. They will then be paired up with their "little" from 3rd grade (Jefferson K-8). Ms. Vogler is also working with MyPath to get students registered for the ACT if they are thinking of taking College Credit Plus (CCP) classes next year during their Senior year. All Juniors will take the SAT in the Spring during the school day but if students do want to take the ACT, it will be at no cost to them.
