

ADMINISTRATOR'S SPOTLIGHT!

THIS ISSUE -DR. ULICNY, FRESHMAN PRINCIPAL

WGH has some exciting news following the November 29 Board of Education meeting ... we will be offering six new classes for our students during the 2023-2024 school year! Detailed course descriptions will be in the course catalogue that will be available for students in January as they start

their scheduling process. Here is a brief description of each of the new courses:

Advanced Placement Computer Science Principles – This is an AP course that introduces students to the breadth of the field of computer science. Students will learn to design and evaluate solutions and to apply computer science to solve problems through the development of algorithms and programs.

Advanced Placement African-American Studies PILOT – WGH was selected as one of the schools to pilot this new course. This course is designed to offer high school students an evidence-based introduction to African American studies by reaching into a variety of fields—literature, the arts and humanities, political science, geography, and science—to explore the vital contributions and experiences of African Americans.

History in Hollywood – this course focuses on teaching critical thinking and analysis of historical events. Students will compare the accuracy of Hollywood's portrayals through contemporary media and technology.

Mythology – In this course, students will be introduced to myths and legends from around the world (with a deep focus on Greek, Roman and Norse Mythology as well as Arthurian Legend). Students will engage in literary analysis and writing throughout the course and will be evaluated through a series of projects.

Creative Writing – Introduction to Creative Writing is intended to introduce students to various forms and genres of creative writing. The course will have a focus on workshopping through the writing process.

Forensics – This course focuses on the skills and concepts behind crime scene investigation and forensic science. If students desire to be crime scene investigators, forensic pathologists, or some other medical scientists, this course will help them hone their investigative skills and review a wide range of science concepts. Students will learn to observe, collect, analyze, and evaluate evidence associated with criminal cases.

COLLEGEBOARD SUITE OF TESTS

Warren G. Harding gives the collegeboard suite of assessments throughout a student's first three years of high school. Students take the PSAT 8/9 in September/October of 9th grade.

- Students who took the test this year will be receiving their results, linking their results to Khan Academy which will provide a personalized prep and review plan in January. This test identifies a student's AP Potential and a projected score for the SAT>
- ◆ 10th Grade students will take the PSAT 10 on February 22. These results will be linked to their 9th grade PSAT results as well.
- ◆ 11th Grade students will take the SAT on March 1. This is provided by the state of Ohio.
- Collegeboard also includes all AP assessments.

CLASS OF 2023 UPDATES

Senior Elevation Rounds: Mr. Cheffo will be in Sr. Elevation classrooms on Wednesdays to be of assistance to students with academic/college related questions and needs.

College Applications / Common Applications: College application deadlines are fast approaching. The deadline for each university varies, see your selected college for specific details and dates. Take time to review your applications to make sure you have all the materials needed to complete the application process. Please request transcripts through Naviance so I can forward them to your chosen colleges. See me for any questions that you may have.

FAFSA Information: If you wish to apply for Financial Aid for the 2023/2024 academic year, you must fill out a Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) at this website, https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa or you can contact our MYPATH representative at school for assistance. There are some students that feel college will be too expensive, the FAFSA is the 1st step in gaging how affordable college will be. Students may be able to receive a Pell Grant which they will not have to pay back later. This grant can make a substantial difference in reducing the cost of tuition.

OHIO MEANS JOBS Seal: If you haven't handed in your pink form to your elevation teacher please do so before the end of the semester. The form should be signed by your supervisor/ employer or other designated community member.

Remember that if you need an industry credential, you must hand in the OMJ form as a prerequisite for the credential. If you need a new form, see me as soon as possible.

NOW AVAILABLE AS AN APP
