



Academic Updates: A Glimpse into the Classrooms

Grade 3:

3rd grade will be continuing to examine expository nonfiction which provides factual information about a topic. They will continue their friendly letters that explain their thinking about new information. In math, students will be working on rounding, estimation, and multi-digit addition and subtraction. Students will use their estimating skills to approximate solutions to problems, and to determine the reasonableness of their answers.

Grade 4:

4th grade students will be continuing to examine expository nonfiction and procedural texts. We are working hard to merge Social Studies and Science with what we are going in Reading and Writing. In math, students work with a variety of tools, including folded paper strips, egg cartons, geoboards, number lines, and base ten pieces to model, read, write, compare, order, compose, and decompose fractions and decimals.

Grade 5:

5th graders will be continuing to write about their reading in Reading Workshop so that they can share their thoughts about what they have read. Students are working hard to create a connection between reading, writing, and the content areas. Students' study skills and concepts related to place value, from reading, writing, and comparing decimals to rounding and examining the decimal patterns of multiplying and dividing numbers by 10.
