Grade 7The Essential Question in grade 7 is Should we make a home in space? During the month of November the students<br/>will be writing an Argument essay on the topic of Should we spend valuable resources on space exploration? All of the texts<br/>the students will be reading this month are selected to help them answer the question one way or another. Lessons that will<br/>be taught during this month are; Central Idea, Theme, Citing Evidence, Point of View and the TAPE strategy. # MATH

Grade 6 Students will continue to develop their algebra skills. They will be learning how to use variables to represent a quantity they don't know, how to use that variable to write an expression as well as solve it. Later in the month we will be learning how to reduce and enlarge figures appropriately/proportionally.

Grade 7 I hope that you have notice that your child has homework Monday-Thursday. You should see their blue binder and book on these days. Homework is a bit of a problem. We ready to finish chapter 2. Your child will be assessed as an individual and on a TEAM basis. When we start Chapter 3, "Arithmetic Properties," the content that will be covered in this chapter is as follows: 1- Strategies for grouping operations, 2-subtraction of integers and 3-extending the students understanding of operations with fractions and decimals to include division. Parent/Teacher Conferences for PK-8 will be held on November 19, 2019 (Tuesday) and November 21, 2019(Thursday). Both days will be from 4-7 pm. I hope to see you at this time. <u>Compacted Math</u> We are working on ratios and proportions. Homework is sent home on Monday and turned in by Friday of that same week. Students will not have homework on the week of tests, since they need the feedback from their homework to help them prepare for tests. Students need to be turning in assignments on time and come to class with all materials on time. Please reinforce the Warren acronym at home: Work ethic, Accountability, Responsibility, Respect, Effective Behavior, and No excuses.

Grade 8 As we progress through Chapter three, 8<sup>th</sup> graders will continue to work with graphs, tables, and equations to represent situations mathematically. Later in the chapter we will be working with Algebra Tiles again to solve equations. We will progress to solving equations without the tiles and determining if our equations have one, none, or many solutions. Into chapter four, we will continue our practice of making connections among graphs, tables, patterns, and rules with word problems. We will be putting our situations into y = mx + b to make an easy transition to graphing our equations. Additional help is provided in the ebook if students are having trouble; all students have been given a sign-on to get the textbook via the internet. #### Science

6<sup>th</sup> Grade Science I can't believe it's November already. Our sixth grade scientists will be working on our rock unit in Earth Science. We will begin by learning about Rock properties. Then, the students will learn about the different types of rocks and how they are formed. If time in November, our scientists will be studying and learning about Fossils.

7<sup>th</sup> Grade Science - Seventh grade science will be focusing energy transformation and the conservation of energy. Students will analyze the ways in which energy changes form, but the energy is neither created nor destroyed. In addition, students will evaluate the way energy is transferred by conduction, convection and radiation and how these concepts apply to everyday life.

8<sup>th</sup> Grade Science- "Hello 8th Grade Families! We are leaving Physics behind for now, and diving into Earth Science. During the month of November, your student will brush up on the concepts of Earth's Interior, Plate Tectonics, and Continental Drift. This unit places a large emphasis on reading, writing, and practical problem solving skills. Ask your child to talk with you about our Earth's rich Geological history to support learning at home! Go Raiders!"

Grade 6 Sixth grade social studies will have the opportunity to see a world beyond the borders of our town, state, and country-and particularly to S see the world as it was before our time. Students will begin studying Ancient Mesopotamia. Learn-0 ing to do research on the internet and creating С presentations or writing papers using this information is an important part of our social studies Т curriculum. Students will become archaeologist А

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Grade 7 In seventh grade social studies we are working on Ancient Rome. We will explore the legacy of Rome and look closely at their government and compare it to our government in the United States. We will also look at their achievements and the legacy that they left on the world. We will examine how their government changed from a republic to an empire. Lastly we will exam-T ine how their civilization came to an end.

Grade 8 Our eighth graders are enjoying finishing up our learning about early explorers and settlements. In November, we will be learning about the American Revolution. The students will be focusing on the causes of the American Revolution. The students are really enjoying learning about the history of our country.
